Approximately 180,000 African Americans, comprising 163 units served in the Union Army during the American Civil War. In general, it was believed that "black men" lacked the ability to fight, and fight well. However, those ideas were quickly dispelled by the gallantry and bravery that African American soldiers displayed in every battle in which they participated. Mitchell Capel and Sonny Kelly are "a force to be reckoned with" as they bring to life a fraction of the untold stories of the hundreds of thousands of unsung heroes...heroes whose glory and honor have remained unspoken for entirely too long. With its powerfully poetic embodiment of these rare stories, framed by a multi-media presentation, this experience leaves audiences breathlessly enlightened and encouraged. This work brings to



life an array of these African American soldiers, their stories and their struggles.

<u>RIDER</u>

- 2 Chairs without arms
- 2 Headset microphones
- 1 Large screen (at least 4ft X 4ft) and projector capable of projecting a PowerPoint slide show during the performance
- 1 CD player or Audio Visual system capable of playing CD or digital sound files
- 3 technicians to run lights, slides and sound
- Minimum of 1 hour set-up and break down time
- Stage lighting preferred, but not required

TIMING

Run time: 70 minutes without Q & A. Can be adjusted according to needs.

<u>SPACE</u>

Minimum of 10ft X 6ft playing space, preferably on an elevated stage. Backstage space required for exits and entrances.

<u>COST</u>

\$10,000 + travel and lodging costs for one full performance, followed by an optional additional hour of Discussion and Q & A.

*Additional cost of \$500 per performance + travel and lodging for Technical Director if audio/visual technicians are not provided (audio, visual, and lighting technicians require 3 to 5 hours of rehearsal with the performers)

*Prices for additional performances in the same area and timeframe are negotiable. *Discounts available for non-profit organizations
