



What does a daddy say to his baby boy when the boogeyman is real? Confronted by a surge in White supremacist activity and Confederate nostalgia in the nation that he calls home, one father struggles to explain an apparent wave of hatred and bigotry to his son. In HAUNTED, actor and playwright Sonny Kelly takes on the voices of historians, ancestors, preachers, politicians, pundits, and poets, as he traces the roots and routes of modern-day anti-Black violence and racial division in America. Kelly recounts the roots of hatred and fear embedded in the story of the 1898 lynching of Manley McCauley in Orange County, North Carolina. He also tracks the routes of racialized violence in America as manifested in the colonial justice system, the Wilmington Massacre of 1898, the 2015 shooting at the Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, South Carolina, and the 2020 lynching of Ahmaud Arbery in Brunswick, Georgia. Kelly digs deep to examine the impact that racial violence has historically had on our minds, bodies, and souls in the land of the free and the home of the brave.

Objectives:

- To connect to audiences in a visceral way that will bring history to life while honoring the sanctity of familial relationships, human dignity, and love.
- To enrich audience members' perspectives, inciting action toward more just, equitable, and honest conversations about our past and our present.
- To reflect on America's history in a holistic, honorable, and honest manner.

A One-Man Theatrical Storytelling Experience

RIDER

- 1 Tall table (4 feet high, 3 ft by 3 ft)
- 1 solid chair
- 1 large projector screen
- 1 projector that can project a PowerPoint slideshow
- Audio system that allows for sound cues to be projected in the performance area (all sound files are MP3 files) *This show can be run with one technician if the audio and visual equipment can be collocated.

TIMING

Run time: 90 minutes without Q & A. Can be adjusted according to needs.

SPACE

Minimum of 10ft X 6ft playing space, preferably on an elevated stage.

COST

\$5,000 + travel and lodging costs for one full performance, followed by an optional additional hour of Discussion and Q & A.

*Additional cost of \$500 per performance + travel if technicians are not provided.

\$2,500 + travel and lodging costs for excerpts of the performance and the facilitation of interactive community discussions and workshops for up to three hours. (\$500 per additional hour)

\$1,500 for the rental of an online video version of the full performance.



*Prices for additional performances in the same area during the same visit are negotiable.
